

Treaty	When?	With?	Details?
Treaty of Redon	1489	England and Brittany	Henry agreed to send 6000 troops to defend Brittany Anne in return agreed to pay for the troops and not marry or make alliances without Henry's consent.
Treaty of Dordrecht	1489	England and Maximilian, Holy Roman Emperor	Henry agreed to send 3000 troops to help Maximilian.
Treaty of Medina del Campo	1489	England and Spain	Henry and Spain agreed to go to war against France to recover lost territories (Normandy and Aquitaine) and protect Brittany. Cemented by the arrangement of marriage between Arthur and Catherine of Aragon. Led to Henry declaring his claim to the French crown.
Treaty of Etaples	1492	England and France	France agreed to a substantial financial compensation - French pension, £159,000 in return for England removing all its troops from French soil, except Calais. France did win Brittany. Also stated France would not harbour pretenders.
Holy League of Venice	1496	Papal States, Venice, Naples, Spain, Milan and HRE	Against France - who had invaded Italy. Showed England was a major player on the European stage and he also gained recognition from the Pope.
Treaty of Ayton	1497	Scotland	Agreed a 7 year peace with Scotland - peace ended Scotland's support of Warbeck.
Treaty of Perpetual Peace	1502	Scotland	Extended the peace between England and Scotland for the lifetime of both monarch's and their heirs. Arranged marriage of Margaret and James IV.
Treaty of Aachen	1502	Holy Roman Emperor	Henry promised to give Maximilian 10,000 crowns to fund war with Turkey. In return Maximilian promised to stop harbouring Henry's enemies - Edmund de la Pole.
Treaty of Blois	1505	Ferdinand of Spain and France	Ferdinand agreed to marry Louis' niece - Germaine de Foix Ferdinand had French support in the Castille succession crisis against his daughter Joanna and her husband Philip.
Treaty of Windsor	1506	Burgundy - secret treaty	Philip was forced to sign the Intercursus Malus - favourable trade terms. He had to hand over Earl of Suffolk. Henry has now got rid of the biggest threats to his throne - pretenders, de la Poles have all been handed over through foreign policy agreements. Henry agreed to support Joanna and Philip as the new heirs to Castille - he gave them £138,000 to fund their campaign.
